

Greyhound Rescue Fife couple warn of crisis

Celia and Jimmy Fernie, who run Greyhound Rescue Fife say the centre is bursting at the seams with unwanted dogs. They currently have 55 canines, ranging in age from two to five years old.

The couple have temporarily reduced their adoption fee from £180 to £100, in the hope of encouraging people to rehome them. Celia, 77, and Jimmy, 86, say people are struggling to rehome dogs now as a result of the cost-of-living crisis. "People are too strapped for cash," says Celia. "Prices of dog food, vet fees and insurance have rocketed." The adoption fee of £100 covers neutering, vaccination and a collar.

The Fernies have run the centre for 18 years. In that time they have successfully rehomed more than 1800 greyhounds. "We know where every dog has come from and where every dog goes," says Celia. "They are all in good condition. There are various reasons they've been handed over for adoption. Some are ex-racers and others have never raced. In the last two years the Greyhound Board has given us a contribution for their welfare, but with 55 dogs here now, we have no space to take in others."

Greyhounds are often misunderstood – they don't actually need much exercise and are very lazy, sleeping around 18 hours a day. "They're very gentle and sweet-natured," says Celia. "We've rescued greyhounds for almost two decades and never in that time have I, or any or my staff or volunteers, been bitten. They've got such a lovely temperament."

As well as greyhounds, Celia and Jimmy often take in strays of all breeds. They have nine of their own "house dogs" and they've cared for a one-winged rook for 12 years.

Centre volunteer Gillian Taylor and her husband Ewen rehomed her greyhound Ollie from the facility in September last year. "Celia in particular is an amazing match-maker," says Gillian, who lives in Lower Largo. "She always meets the person interested in taking a dog and will match them with one she thinks will suit their personality, even if it's not the one they initially showed interest in."

I'm not normally one that goes for all this fancy stuff, a dogs a dog as far as I'm concerned and facials, blow drying, mud treatments are for hoomans but when a new dog grooming shop (Hudson's Haven) opened near my home in Sauchie, Alloa I was more than a little intrigued about what happened behind the frosted glass and what was on offer for our 4 legged fur babies.

I started following on Facebook and the reviews were amazing full of glowing reports from happy hoomans and loads of cute photos of neat and tidy dogs.

My nosiness got the better of me and I ventured into this new and exciting world.

I was greeted by the owner Lynnemarie who I think could sense my fear and we chatted about dogs and what sort of treatments she could offer and more specifically about what she could offer Parker, a dog that gets brushed, but only washed if dirty (that's what rain is for right) and never blow dried or preened.

We decided on a soothing bath, brush, blow dry with a check on his claws and ears and then a de-shedding mud bath treatment to assist in the removal of all his old fur and to sooth any dry skin.

Along we trotted on Thursday morning - I was still a little sceptical about what could be achieved but Parker seemed happy enough to disappear into the back room with Lynnemarie without even looking back to see if I was following. I returned about 90min later to the find this sweet smelling, shiny furred, dog lying like a prince on the couch. I had never seen his white fur so white or his black fur so glossy.

He had a clean face (normally has food remnants around his mouth and nose) and he honestly looked happy and contented.
