Xylitol – Warning!

Mark Mackenzie has alerted us to the dangers of some brands of peanut butter.

A new type of peanut butter and other types of nut butter is being sold with less sugar but it contains the sweetener xylitol. This is what is used in sugarless gum and it can be deadly to dogs. Many of us use peanut butter as a dog treat, to fill a kong or to disguise medications. Do check the ingredients in any jar of peanut butter you consider buying and, if it contains xylitol, do not buy it. It could be very dangerous.

Bake Sale


